Each of these manuscripts bears a heading giving the provenance of its original, and each is further certified as being a true copy. Heading and certificate are reproduced with the first document of the translation, but it has not been thought worth while to repeat them with the remainder. The papers of this collection fall more or less naturally into groups: - Letters and orders, diaries, reports and returns. The list of sea - and shore-signals, and one set of naval instructions, have with the returns been placed last as being somewhat detached, logically, from the substance of the other papers. They have their significance and interest, however, in that they reveal the extreme care...
